## CHAPTER 7.20. - ALL-TERRAIN AND OFF-ROAD VEHICLES

Sec. 7.20.010. - State all-terrain vehicle laws adopted. The provisions describing and defining regulations with respect to all-terrain vehicles in Wis. Stats. § 23.33 and any future amendments or revisions, are adopted by reference and made part of this section as if fully set forth herein. Any acts required to be performed by the following statutory subsections or which are prohibited by such statutory subsections are required to be performed by this section or are prohibited by this section.

# Sec. 7.20.020. - Unauthorized operation of motor vehicles on public or private property.

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- a. A commercially designed and manufactured motor driven device that does not meet
  federal motor vehicle safety standards in effect on July 1, 2012, that is not a golf
  cart, low-speed vehicle, dune buggy, mini-truck, or tracked vehicle, that is designed
  to be used primarily off of a highway, and that has, and was originally manufactured
  with all of the following:
  A weight, without fluids, of 2,000 pounds or less.
   Four or more low- pressure tires or nonpneumatic tires.
   A steering wheel.

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- A brakelight.

  Two headlights.

  A width of not more than 65 inches.

  A width of seat belts, or a similar system for retraining each occupant of the vehicle in the event of an accident.

  A system of structural members designed to reduce the likelihood that an occupant would be crushed as the result of a rollover of the device.

- b. A commercially designed and manufactured motor driven device to which all of the following applies:

  i. It has a weight, without fluids, of more than 900 pounds but not more than 2,000 pounds.

  ii. It has a width of 50 inches or less.

  iii. It is equipped with a seat designed to be straddled by the operator.

  iv. It travels on three or more low-pressure tires or pneumatic tires.

  c. Restriction on equipment. No ATV/UTV may be operated on any street within the city limits unless it confirms to all noise, registration and other equipment requirements as stated in chapter 23 Wis. Stats., or the Municipal Code of the city.

  C. ATV/UTV rules of operation.

  1. Operators must have attained the age of 16 and must have a valid driver's license to operate an ATV/UTV on any ATV/UTV route designated by the city.

  2. Helmets must be worn on any operator or passenger of an ATV/UTV if they are under the age of 18. If the driver of the vehicle is required to wear a helmet, then all vehicle
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- occupants must wear a helmet.
  Seat belts must be worn on UTVs by all persons at all times.
  Eye protection must be worn by any operator of an ATV/UTV.
  ATVs/UTVs shall operate only on the paved portion of the roadway. Opera gravel shoulders, grassy in-slopes, ditches, or other rights-of-way is probilegal.
  Sidewalk operation of ATV/UTV within the City of Omro is prohibited.

  8. ATV/UTVs must be registered for public use through the Department of Natural Resources and display such registration on the vehicle.

  9. ATV/UTVs must be insured to the minimum Wisconsin Department of Transportation insurance requirements as follows:

  a. \$10,000 for property damage.

  b. \$25,000 for the injury or death of one person.

  c. \$50,000 for the injury or death of two persons.

  10. Headlights must always be operational and visible from 200 feet and taillights must always be operational and visible from 500 feet in the hours of darkness.

  11. Speed limit on city ATV/UTV routes is 25mph.

  12. Operators shall operate in single file on the right side of the roadway.

  13. Hand signals shall be used when turning, or turn signals used if vehicle is so equipped.

  14. City residents wishing to use the city ATV/UTV routes may travel directly from their residence to the nearest city ATV/UTV route; provided that they take the most direct route.

  15. Hours of operation are from 7:00 a.m. to 10:00 p.m.

  16. Operators of UTVsATVs on county highways assume all the usual and normal risks of ATV/UTV operation.

  17. Three or more violations will result in revocation of route privileges.

  Sec. 7:20.040 ATV/UTV Routes Established.

  A. City of Omro roadways designated as ATV/UTV routes shall be established and approved by the Police Chief, Public Works Director; City Administrator, Planning Commission and Common Council. Together, the above listed entities shall develop policies and procedures for designation of ATV/UTV routes, including appropriate criteria for making a designation. Any modification to a designated ATV/UTV route shall be approved by the common council per ordinance amendment. A copy of ATV/UTV routes, along with a map showing their locations, shall be kept on file at the offices of the City Clerk and Police Department: The Planning Commission shall have the authority to close or terminate any ATV/UTV route on the city roadway system on a permanent basis, subject to approval by the common council.

  City of Omro ATV/UTV routes can be closed temporarily at any time by the City Administrator or Police Chief when public safety is at risk.

  C. The City of Omro ATV/UTV routes are intended for recreational travel to and from other ATV/UTV routes located outside the city, places of business, or other destinations along the City of Omro ATV/UTV routes are not intended for continuous circular travel on the city ATV/UTV routes only.

  D. The following are City of Omro ATV/UTV routes:

  1. East West Route: From East city limits on Lincoln Avenue, then west on Kiwanis Street, then south on McKinley Avenue, crossing Main Street (Hwy 21) with slight jog to go south to Michigan Street to the west on Huron Street to Washington Avenue, then south on McKinley Avenue, then west on Huron Street to Washington Avenue, then

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- Route: Harrison Avenue south to East Scott then north on Industrial Drive, then east on t Street, then east on Barnard Drive to t on East Scott

  Alder Avenue
- (route end)
- North Route: Adams Avenue north to bridge crossing to Spruce Street, then north to Balsam Street, then north to Poygan Road to northwestern city limits (route end).
- . Connector Routes: a. Harr b. East

  . East Scott Street from Industrial Drive to east city limits.

  5. Hwy. 21 / Hwy. 116 Bridge Crossing: See also §23.33(11)(am)(3)(a-d), Wis. Stats.

  6. The operation of ATV/UTV is permitted on a highway bridge that is not part of the national system of interstate and defense highways, that is 1,000 feet in length or less, and that is located within the territorial boundaries of the city whether the city has jurisdiction over the highway bridge, provided that a person crossing the bridge while operating an ATV/UTV shall do all of the following:

  a. Cross the bridge in the most direct manner practicable and at a place where no obstruction prevents a quick and safe crossing.

  b. Stay as far to the right of the roadway or shoulder as practicable.

  c. Stop the vehicle prior to the crossing.

  d. Yield the right-of-way to other vehicles, pedestrians, and electric personal assistive mobility devices using the roadway or shoulder.

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- Sec. 7.20.050 Signage for ATV/UTV Routes.

  A. Pursuant to Wis. Stats. §23.33(8)(d), the following restrictions are placed on the use of ATV/UTV routes designated by this chapter:

  1. Routes shall be marked with uniform ATV/UTV route signs in accordance with Wis. Admin. Code §NR 64.12(7). The city public works department has sole responsibility for ATV/UTV signage on city streets. No person may do any of the following, in regard to, signs marking ATV/UTV routes:

  a. Intentionally remove, damage, deface, move, or obstruct any uniform ATV/UTV routes:

  a. Intentionally remove, damage, deface, move, or obstruct any uniform ATV/UTV route or trail sign or standard or intentionally interfere with the effective operation of any uniform all-terrain vehicle route or trail sign.

  b. Possess any uniform ATV/UTV route or trail sign or standard of the type established by the department for the warning, instruction or information of the public, unless obtained in a lawful manner. Possession of a uniform ATV/UTV route or trail sign or standard creates a rebuttable presumption of illegal possession.

  2. ATV/UTV operation shall be subject to all provisions of Wis. Stats. §23.33, which is adopted by reference as a part of this chapter.

  B. Route Maintenance. Designation of segments of the city roadways as ATV/UTV routes does not impose upon the city public works department a greater duty of care or responsibility for Sec. 7.20.060 Enforcement.

  This article shall be enforced by any officer employed by the Omro police department and county sheriffs department or any other segment of froadway.

  Sec. 7.20.070 Violations and penalties.

  A. The penalty for operating any ATV/UTV of the roadway designated an ATV/UTV route (e.g., the gravel shoulder, grassy in-slope, ditch, or other right-of-way) or violating any other provision of this chapter shall result in a forfeiture of not less than \$25.00 nor more than \$500.00, plus count costs. Citations may be issued in accordance with the deposit softedule set forth in this section, which does
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- B. Any person who shall violate any provision of this chapter shall be subject to a penalty as determined by the Uniform Wisconsin Schedule for Deposit or Cash Bail Traffic Offenses set forth pursuant to authority contained in Section §346.26(2)(a) Wis. Stats. and any amendments thereto. Juveniles 16 to or 17 years of age are treated as adults for ATV/UTV violations.

  C. Where no bond or deposit is established by this schedule for a traffic violation, bond should be set at one-half of the maximum monetary penalty as provided by law.

  In a forfeiture natter, if a penalty is not set forth, see Section 939.61(1) Wis. Stats. which provides a forfeiture not to exceed \$200.00.

  E. This schedule contains demerit point assignments for certain traffic offenses. In situations where no demerit points are assessed and there is a question whether a conviction for a certain violation will appear on the driver record, the Department of Transportation should be contacted for verification. Persons who hold a probationary license, instruction permit, or no license at all, will be assessed the regular number of demerit points for their first conviction. Points will be doubled for second and subsequent convictions except for convictions under chapter 347 Wis. Stats.
